

Cinder Hill Fly Fishing Summer Newsletter 2022

I can't believe we are now nearly the end of June, and the South of England Show is behind us already! This season has been excellent so far with some great catches from all the lakes, most notably a 4lb brown which overwintered and came out on 1st April at Cinder Hill along with many of the larger fish which were stocked for the Macmillan charity fishing day in May. There have been many bag limits and good catch and release numbers recorded, and of course a few blanks too. The advantage of membership is that you can just go again as with 25 annual visits there is no pressure like a commercial water! Remember you can use 2 visits per week currently, but they must not be at the same venue as this helps balance out demand at the lakes. We will continue to stock until the conditions are not favourable and this is usually fortnightly.

As I write we have had the summer's first high temperatures rising into the upper 20's and a lack of rain means the fishing will get more difficult. Please note this has now resulted in all catch and release to be suspended for this season. However, be assured there are plenty of fish in both Piplye and Cinder Hill and the longer they remain in there they will be more focussed on the natural food so flies that worked a few weeks ago will probably not now.

Membership is now closed for 2022 and we welcome our many new members who have joined us this year.

Work parties

Please join our work parties when the details are emailed out, the syndicate is entirely run by ourselves, and the regular sessions are a great way to meet other members and become involved in the day-to-day maintenance of our lakes. This usually involves cutting back and strimming the banks, lopping a few branches, and removing weed from two of the lakes at Piplye.
